"In a values-based school the shared values language comes to inform everything that a school does and says. It underpins pedagogy, leadership, planning, policy positions, curriculum practices and behavioural expectations. If there is no common values language, if the values within the school are neither owned nor shared by the school community, there can be no basis for implementing effective, planning and systematic values education."



Dr Neil Hawkes has had a successful career as a teacher, headteacher, chief education adviser and Local Education Authority officer in the UK. From 1992, he spent 7 years as Headteacher of West Kidlington Primary and Nursery School in Oxford, UK. It was here that the school community worked together to devise and implement a unique system of Values Education that has become well-known throughout the world.

In 1996, Neil worked with a group of international educators at UNICEF headquarters in New York, USA, to found the education programme, Living Values. This charity works with organisations such as UNESCO to underpin education systems with Values Education. Neil is a Director of ALIVE (The Association of Living Values International) which is a charity registered in Switzerland that coordinates Living Values Education. Neil is also Director of The Values Education Trust which is currently being constituted in the UK to inspire schools to adopt Values Education.

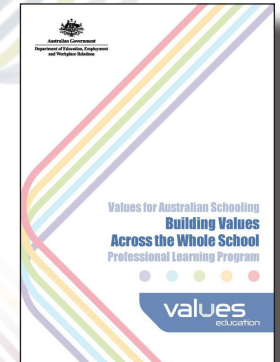
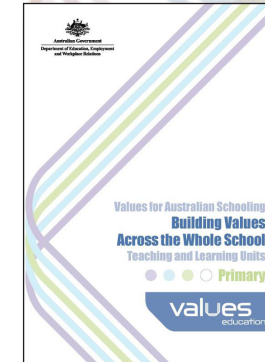
